Re: Traffic / Parking

I have been requested to address the traffic/ parking situation in the following areas:

- 1) Huff Avenue between School Street and Spruce Street
- 2) Sheridan Avenue between Ashland Street and Oak Street
- 3) Oak Street from Coulter Avenue to Sheridan Avenue

After meeting with Members of the Police Committee and Mayor Dobies, It Has been determined that this letter Shall serve as notice how the traffic and parking problems will be addressed by the South Greensburg Police Department.

<u>ALL</u> Parking restrictions as described in Pennsylvania Vehicle Code (Title 75) and the South Greensburg Borough Code WILL be enforced by the Police Department. Some of the most common violations are, but are Not limited to:

- 1) Parking Anywhere official signs prohibit parking
- 2) Parking in front of a private driveway
- 3) Parking within fifteen (15) feet of a fire Hydrant
- 4) Parking within thirty (30) feet of the following
 - a. Intersection
 - b. Stop sign
 - c. Yield sign
 - d. Traffic Control signal
 - e. Flashing Signal
- 5) Parking within an intersection
- 6) Parking on Private property
- 7) Parking Anywhere that will interfere with the normal movement of traffic OR constitute a safety hazard.

Please be advised that said violation may be enforced by Police Officer observing a violation while on duty OR from a complaint filed by a citizen.

Parking restrictions WILL also be placed on the grass area on the East side of Oak Street, the restricted area will be identified by cones/ posts/ rope/ tape Etc. NO vehicles will be permitted to park within the restricted area.

ALL Borough parking Tickets are fifteen (15) Dollars and Must be paid within five (5) days, to avoid further legal actions/ fees. Check or Money Order ONLY.
