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- APPLICATION FOR SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL PERMIT -

REFERENCE. Placement and Use of Roll-Off Containers

GENERAL. To insure the safe and effective utilization of roll-off containers, no person shall place or utilize any roll-off container within the Borough of South Greensburg without first obtaining a Solid Waste Disposal Permit for such roll-off container in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 142 of the Code of Ordinances, as amended by Ordinance No. 2012-10 (known as the Borough of South Greensburg Solid Waste Disposal Ordinance).

REGULATIONS. See REVERSE SIDE for Regulations and Conditions governing the placement and use of roll-off containers upon proper approval.

APPLICATION. Prior to the placement or utilization of a roll-off container, applicants for a Solid Waste Disposal Permit shall complete and file with the Borough Secretary this application for approval.

REGULATIONS & CONDITIONS - Placement & Use of Roll-Off Containers

Upon being granted approval by the Borough to place and utilize a roll-off container, the following regulations and conditions will apply:

- Measures and procedures to prevent and minimize fire hazards shall be established and practiced at the site of the roll-off container.
- If any portion of a roll-off container is located on a public street, then safety devices (reflective traffic cones, triangles or illuminated amber lights) will be required to mark the front and rear of the roll-off container to prevent safety hazards.
- Litter control measures in and about the roll-off container shall be provided to prevent litter to accumulate in the area surrounding the roll-off container.
- Provisions shall be made to prevent dust from causing health or safety hazards or public nuisances.
- Operations and use of the roll-off containers shall in no way cause health or safety hazards or public nuisances. The area surrounding the roll-off containers shall be cleaned daily to prevent odors, vectors and other nuisances. No drainage shall emit from the roll-off container.
- The roll-off container shall be provided with a suitable cover which shall remain in place during the entire time of the use of the roll-off container.
- Vehicles transporting the roll-off containers shall travel only those designated routes that are established by the Borough Secretary with Borough Council's approval.
- Any Solid Waste Disposal Permit granted shall be valid for a period of thirty (30) days after its date of issuance. Each Solid Waste Disposal Permit must be renewed monthly, if necessary, before the expiration date set forth on the permit.
- The fee to cover the cost associated with issuance of a Solid Waste Disposal Permit or permit renewal shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per permit, which fee shall be paid immediately upon issuance of a Solid Waste Disposal Permit or permit renewal.
- A Solid Waste Disposal Permit shall be required for each roll-off container.
- The Borough Secretary may immediately suspend a Solid Waste Disposal Permit issued in accordance with Chapter 142 of the Code of Ordinances, as amended by Ordinance No. 2012-10, if a permittee or any of the agents, servants or employees of such permittee are in violation of the Ordinance or any of the rules and regulations pursuant thereto. Citations shall be issued daily if violations continue.
- The Borough Secretary, or his designee, the fire official, law enforcement officer, zoning official or representative of the Borough of South Greensburg shall have the authority to inspect all roll-off containers as often as may be necessary for the purpose of ascertaining or causing to be corrected any condition which may be a violation of Chapter 142 of the Code of Ordinances, as amended by Ordinance No. 2012-10, or any rule or regulation promulgated there under.
- Solid Waste Disposal Permits are not transferable or assignable under any circumstances.
